PHYSICAL PLANT DESCRIPTION

The first floor has 18 classrooms, two offices, four bathrooms, an auditorium, lunch room, kitchen, and two gymnasiums. The second floor has 25 classrooms, a library, four bathrooms, four offices, and a teacher's lounge.
